Today marks the 100th Anniversary of that agreement. Veteran's Post 242 asked FRC to ring its steeple bells at 11 AM as "The Bells of Peace." So, at 11th hour on the 11th day of the 11th month, we will mark this occasion with 21 tolls of the bell and then together sing, "O God, Our Help in Ages Past."
